A message from the Head Teacher

This short term has been a brilliant start back for everyone. Our children and young people have transitioned back into school exceptionally well and school is returning to some normality. To see the return of the socially-distanced hustle and bustle of the school rather than the ghost-town that it was, fills my heart with joy. Attendance has been strong and is hovering around 85%. Shielding guidance ends on Wednesday 31 March 2021 and we are looking to welcome back those remaining few young people. I know this can be an anxious time, but we are still upholding high standards of risk management.

We are still maintaining our bubbles within school and I am thrilled we haven't needed to close down any class groups or pathways since our return. With lockdown easing, this means we can start returning to some of our more exciting curriculum activities including swimming and our Learning Outside the Classroom activities at Baggeridge Country Park. These community activities are going to enrich our curriculum offering and provide access to resources that our young people desperately need.

The school will be providing free school meal vouchers over the Easter break and you will receive these in the usual way. Although lockdown measures are now easing, please keep safe and inform us of any potential COVID-19 symptoms; we aren't out of the woods yet.

We are in the midst of planning for next academic year in the form of recruitment, curriculum redesign, class groupings and timetabling. Alongside all of this The Westminster Specialist College (SPI) will open in September 2021 for a small cohort of 12 young people. This is very much a pilot year, however the principles of a person-centred preparing for adulthood study programme remain at the heart of everything we do.

I hope you have a safe and enjoyable Easter break. We return to school on Monday 19 April.
