Parent Governor Vacancy

Due to the current parent governor's term of office coming to an end, we have a vacancy for this position on the Governing Board.

A parent governor is a person who is elected as a member of the Governing Board of the school, by parents of registered pupils at the school and who is a parent at the time of their election. Governors come from all walks of life and bring a rich variety of skills and experience to schools. What Governors at The Westminster School have in common, is a passion for education and a commitment to furthering the life chances of all of the young people we serve.

Parents include:

- The parent of a registered pupil at the school.
- An individual who had or has had parental responsibility for, or cares or has cared for, a child or young person under the age of 19.

A person cannot be a parent governor if they are:

- An elected member of the Local Authority; or
- Paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any consecutive twelve-month period (at the time
 of the election or appointment).

Parent Governors attend regular meetings throughout the school year and will receive an induction and other relevant training and development. All Governors are appointed for four years. If there are more nominations than vacancies, we will conduct a secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting instructions will be sent to all parents and carers. Attendance

The Westminster School continues to strive for excellence for all its pupils. In order to achieve this the school takes attendance very seriously. We firmly believe that good attendance leads to students:

- Making friends and feel included.
- Learning new things and developing skills.
- Increasing confidence and self-esteem.
- Improving their social skills.
- Having better career prospects.
- Achieving their full potential and fulfilling their aspirations.

The school is working hard to raise awareness of the importance of regular attendance and our Attendance Monitoring Group (AMG), chaired by the Head Teacher, meet weekly to discuss attendance and develop strategies to support students and their families to improve attendance. We will continue to update you with your child's attendance. If you would like to discuss any issues regarding attendance or require further support please contact the school through the main office or at attendance@westminster.sandwell.sch.uk. A gentle reminder that morning registers close at 9.20am each morning. Any arrival after this will result in your child having a late mark.

During the summer holidays in 2024 the government changed the guidance for schools regarding attendance and these changes have been reflected in our new school attendance policy which can be found in the policies section of our website.

Mobile Phone Policy

The School has updated its Mobile Phone Policy from 4 November 2024 to align with the Department for Education's guidance on the use of mobile phones in schools.

While the School understands the convenience and importance of mobile phones in today's world, we have reviewed our policy on the use of mobile phones by pupils, staff and visitors during school hours. The DfE's non-statutory mobile phone guidance says that pupils should not use mobile phones throughout the school day. The Westminster School agrees with these principles as we agree that they create significant challenges when used within School. The School is an environment where students deserve to learn without distraction and mobile phones can impact on their ability to engage and communicate effectively with their peers.

This policy also aims to address some of the challenges posed by mobile phones in school, including:



- **Distraction:** Mobile phones can be a significant distraction to students' learning. Constant notifications, games, and social media can interfere with focus and concentration.
- **Cyberbullying:** Unfortunately, mobile phones can be used as a tool for cyberbullying, which can have a negative impact on students' mental health and well-being.
- Theft and loss: Schools have experienced increasing numbers of mobile phones being stolen or lost. This can lead to financial hardship for families and disrupt the learning environment.
- **Data protection:** mobile phones may be used to record video or take photographs which could be shared with other people

The overarching principles of the policy are:

- Pupils can keep mobile phones in a secure location, such as their bags or on their person, but when in school they need to be switched off at all times.
- Pupils should not use their mobile phones during the school day, including during lessons, in the time between lessons, at break times and at lunchtimes.
- If students are unable to self-regulate based on these principles the school expects they will hand them into their Form Tutor at the start of the day during registration time.

We understand that pupils may need to carry phones with them if they are independent travellers or to self-regulate whilst travelling to and from school in minibuses/taxis, which is why we are asking pupils to turn their devices 'off and away, all day' whilst in school.

We believe that by restricting the use of mobile phones during school hours, we can create a more conducive learning environment for all students. We appreciate your understanding and support in implementing this policy.


Students also visited the School House and experienced a 1912 school lesson!

Careers at Westminster

Our students have been gaining valuable work experience and learning about different careers and workplaces this term.

Nearly 80 students are out in work placements at least once a week, gaining real-world experience and developing employability skills. We would like to say a huge thank you to our fantastic network of supportive employers who make this possible – we couldn't do it without them. This is an amazing opportunity for our students to gain workplace experience, develop essential skills, and build their confidence. We couldn't be prouder of how well they've taken on the challenge.

Students have been on placement at a local McDonald's. They have been given their staff uniforms and have also completed their staff induction. They've already jumped straight into their new roles and are excelling. They have been dealing with customer questions and complaints, waiting tables and ensuring that the whole restaurant is clean and tidy. Students have also been involved in work placements at a local care home. They have worked in different departments, experiencing a range of activities including cleaning, care, activities, and hair & beauty. Another student has been on placement at a local soft play centre. We're incredibly proud of our amazing young people taking part in work experience.

We've also had some very special visitors from the DRP Group, a creative agency that specialises in a wide range of services including campaigns, film production, digital solutions, and event management. Their staff introduced us to an amazing new project that students will be taking part in, which involves them applying for roles at DRP such as Show Director, Host, Scriptwriter, Presentation Designer, Animator, Camera Operator, Vision Mixer, Audio Operator, and Lighting Designer. We are going to produce our very own talk show whilst learning all about show productions.

These opportunities are fantastic for developing skills, building confidence, and making a positive impact on the community. Well done to all our students involved!

School Uniform

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers of our school uniform policy. We pride ourselves in preparing students for their lives after Westminster, and this includes wearing appropriate clothing for the setting and activity involved. We are therefore asking for your support in ensuring your child is wearing the appropriate uniform as outlined below.

We do have a bank of school uniform available each day that your child can borrow if required.

Uniform for Pupils in Years 3-11:

- Plain black or grey skirt, trousers or joggers (no large logos)
- Plain White blouse, shirt or polo shirt (embroidered polo shirt available to order)
- Royal blue Jumper or cardigan (embroidered jumpers available to order)
- No hoodies

Uniform for Pupils in Years 12-14:

- Plain black or grey skirt, trousers or joggers (no large logos)
- Plain Black polo shirt (embroidered polo shirt available to order)
- Plain Black sweatshirt (embroidered jumpers available to order)
- No hoodies

PE Kit:

From September 2024 we have been phasing in our new PE kit. This features our new school logo which we will slowly be introducing through the academic year with the official launch in September 2025. The old school logo below will continue to be used on normal school uniform. In order to support parents and pupils with this, we have supplied all students with one bundle of PE kit for academic year 2024/25 only. PE kit can be purchased (should parents wish to buy extra kit) and for future academic years from Ace Embroidery.

The majority of students now have two timetabled PE lessons each week, and should come into school wearing their PE kit on the days that they have PE.

Offsite My Community Visits:

If your child is due to go offsite and the nature of the visit requires alternate clothing, you will receive a letter/text to inform you of the dates for this. On this day, students can come to school in appropriate clothing as outlined in the letter. Please can you ensure that all clothing and belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Ordering Uniform:

If you require financial support to order school uniform or outdoor curriculum clothing for your child, please contact school and ask to speak to our Family Support Worker. For students who are entitled to Pupil Premium, a £75 voucher (one per academic year) can be used partly or in full against a uniform order. There will be either a check box or code to be added at the checkout point which will be verified by the school before the order is delivered.

Uniform can be ordered from Ace Embroidery Ltd, Ace House, Malt Mill Lane, Halesowen B62 8JF. The embroidered uniform products include jumpers, cardigans, polo shirts, book bags, fleeces and many other items. There are sizes available to fit all students. Orders can either be collected from Ace Embroidery directly which is free of charge or can be delivered to your home address with a delivery cost.
