Our students have been gaining valuable work experience and learning about different careers and workplaces this term.

As a school we continue to provide nearly 80 students with work placements at least once a week, gaining real-world experience and developing employability skills. At the end of each term staff complete assessments and speak to employers about their progress so we look forward to the glowing feedback we get about how great our students are.

This term students who are in their final year with us attended a careers fayre at The Hawthorns where they learnt about which providers/employers they may want to start with in September 2025. As a school we appreciate that the thought of transition to a new education provider can be daunting so we aim to provide as much support for families as possible. This academic year we have been pro-active in inviting further education providers, specialist colleges, employers and training providers to carry out assemblies and present to students in more detail their offer. The most notable careers activity that has taken place this term has to be the amazing Post 16 students who attended DRPG in Kidderminster. Students developed their creative skills and were able to plan and deliver a live broadcast to the rest of the school on 4 December. This was truly incredible and the students were amazing.
